

Annual Performance Report 2020-2021

About Us

Canadian Parents for French is a nationwide, research-informed, volunteer organization that represents 35,000 members across Canada and champions the opportunity to learn and use French for all those who call Canada home.

Canadian Parents for French was founded in 1977 by parents who wanted to ensure that children would have the opportunity to become bilingual in the Canadian school system.

Originally a small group of concerned parents who met in Ottawa, Canadian Parents for French has evolved into a proactive National Network with 12 Branches and offices and over 140 Chapters in communities nationwide.

In 2020-2021, in light of the worldwide pandemic, Canadian Parents for French worked together as a national network to lead initiatives in support of Canadian parents and FSL learners, shifting our focus to virtual programming and sharing resources beyond geographical barriers.



President's Message



Wow. What a year 2021 has been. When I wrote this same phrase at the beginning of the 2020 President's report, I certainly did not anticipate still being in this situation an entire year later! Some highlights and some hard times, and another year we will undoubtedly never forget. Throughout all the mayhem, Canadian Parents for French Alberta has been there to support our students and our parents. Our Alberta Branch staff and board members along with our many volunteers have continued to show their dedication to our common belief in the importance of French education in Alberta. We thank all of you who continue to weather the storm and are still actively participating in the pursuit of a bilingual Canada. Merci beaucoup!

Due to the COVID pandemic, there has largely been a hiatus on in-person activities, but we managed to make up for it by expanding our online presence. Staff and members have been busy tweeting, posting, doing interviews, writing open letters and media releases and publishing articles, all in the name of advocacy for our French-language learners. Some of our biggest successes and most popular events have been the Virtual Tutoring program, the Hello Bonjour program, our continued participation in the *Projet Accent*, and of course, the French Family Fun weekends. We even held a virtual Concours and National Conference. CPF continues to prove that we are a resourceful and resilient bunch!

Much like last year, likely one of the biggest issues on the minds of our parents is the safe return to school this fall and what it means for the learning environment both in the classroom and at home. We are also dealing with the proposed new curriculum and the concerns that it seems to have been rushed and has not garnered much acceptance in the education community. In several meetings and consultations with decision-makers including the Minister of Education, CPF AB has clearly stated our requests for the curriculum:

- Revise it so that it aligns with current up-to-date research.
- Increase the focus on oral skills so that our students have confidence in their speaking abilities.
- Re-write it with the second-language perspective in mind.
- Produce a quality document that is not rushed into the classrooms.

Your CPF AB staff and Board members continued to write letters, make phone calls, and hold meetings all year to address issues facing our French second-language learners. Some of these ongoing issues include:

- Linguistic competency of teachers and how their insecurity/lack of language skills will affect their students and their students' future.
- Our French Immersion teachers are still being left to create their own resources to support the on-line environment.
- Sharing of existing resources from one school board to another so we do not end up with "have" and "have not" jurisdictions (in many cases urban versus rural schools).
- Attrition rates in French Immersion programming. We are concerned that since so many of our French Immersion students have English-speaking parents who may feel unable to support their student at home, we may end up seeing parents being forced to choose between French Immersion and safety. High attrition could force school boards/districts to increase class sizes or eliminate French Immersion programming all together.
- Literacy for our young (K to 4) students. We know that consistency in the early years is critical to literacy development for both French and English. With the sudden change in their instruction in March 2020 due to the pandemic, these young students will have a literacy gap in both languages. We need to have the supports in place for teachers and students so that their chosen language of instruction remains the same, and support for parents so that they are confident in the program of choice for their child(ren).
- Ongoing concern about the numbers of qualified French teachers/adequate staffing to facilitate the online French Immersion programming 1-12, and what the Provincial Government can do to attract and retain more teachers.

This list goes on. We are actively doing everything we can to ensure that our students are successful, and we will continue to advocate on their behalf.

I hope that you are finding the help and support that you need for the success of your student(s). Ask questions, attend the CPF National conference, call your local Chapter or Provincial Branch, consult the many resources already posted on the CPF Alberta website, and read the very well-written guide "Yes! You Can Help" (web address below). Let's all remember that French Immersion is a commitment; it takes trust and perseverance and it is so worth it in the end!

Executive Director's Message



2020-21 was a very unique year with significant changes in how we delivered programming, worked together and responding to the actions and initiatives of Alberta's government.

Here are our highlights:

- CPF Alberta's staff has grown again:
 - Isabelle Yeo joined the CPF Alberta team this year and is working three (3) days per week. She is filling the role of Branch Outreach coordinator.
 - Sarah Djellal joined in January and is the Virtual Tutoring Program Coordinator.
 - Kiyana Nanji joined us in March and is a Program Coordinator primarily working in the Virtual Tutoring Program.
 - This was the second year of Alberta's UCP government. Highlights:
 - Significant changes to the Official Languages Education Protocol funding formulas in Alberta were released. These changes meant that French immersion and French second language programs across Alberta had significant cuts to the money that they used to support language consultants, socio-cultural programming, resource materials and – in some cases – staff. CPF Alberta actively advocated at both the provincial and federal levels to reverse this decision and with CPF National to increase the funding right across the country.
 - A proposed grades K-6 curriculum was introduced on March 29 by the Minister of Education with lots of fanfare and much more criticism.
 - CPF Alberta was assigned an official liaison at Alberta Education with whom regular monthly meetings were held. Discussion included the current and proposed curriculum, OLEP funding, community consultation, issues and challenges facing French second language programming.
 - CPF Alberta officially began to support CPF NWT in March of 2020 with myself being additionally appointed as the executive director for the NWT. It also meant that all of the CPF Alberta staff were supporting programming, logistics and communications for CPF NWT, its members and board of directors. A new CPF NWT Program Coordinator was also hired, reported to me and became part of the CPF AB & NWT staff team.
- CPF Alberta became an expert in doing all things "virtual" this past year! Our achievements included:
 - Hosting the 2020 French Family Fun Weekend with performers, trivia games, cooking classes and much more.
 - Planning and hosting four (4) French for the Future Virtual Forms for more than 700 students total!
 - Taking the lead on the CPF Virtual Tutoring Program.
 - Hosting our first-ever virtual CPF Alberta AGM.
 - Promoting both the Concours Virtuelle and the first-ever *Concours d'arts oratoire* Virtual Edition.
 - Things to watch in 2021-22:
 - What – if any – changes are made to the proposed K-6 Alberta curriculum.
 - What the grade 7-12 proposed curriculum will look like.
 - The addition of more OLEP funds for French second language programming.
 - Hosting the French Family Fun Weekends either in-person or hybrid.
 - Taking over the recruitment and scheduling of all students for the virtual tutoring program.
 - Continuing to support CPF NWT and including their coordinator as part of the CPF AB & NWT staff team.

Canadian Parents for French Alberta is also pleased to acknowledge the ongoing support of the Department of Canadian Heritage.




CPF Virtual French Tutoring Program

CPF Alberta partnered in offering a virtual French Tutoring resource for our members. During 2020-2021, we have been able to provide 4-10-week sessions for virtual 1-on-1 tutoring. 

Concours Virtuel


CPF Alberta partnered and participated in the **CPF Concours virtuel: Ensemble à distance – "Ton expérience face au virus"**.

In partnership with French for the Future, CPF Alberta coordinated 4 virtual French for the Future Forums in December 2020 and March 2021. Forums target students in grades 7-8 and 9-12. Each forum consisted of three days of workshops along with resources for teachers and students. It was a wonderful platform to connect students from across the province.

CPF ADVOCACY IN ACTION

Be a French Teacher Program

CPF Alberta partnered with Edmonton Public Schools (EPSB) in a project entitled "Be a French Teacher" (<https://sites.google.com/epsb.ca/be-a-french-teacher/home>).

This project's goal is to encourage French immersion and Core French students to consider the teaching profession as a career option while they are still in junior high school. Ultimately, EPSB's and CPF Alberta's hope is that this will ultimately assist in addressing the French-speaking teacher shortage in Alberta's schools. CPF Alberta assisted in recruiting participants to the focus groups that we ran in June and July 2020 and participated in filming videos and marketing/ promotion of the project.



CPF Alberta Partners with University of Alberta

CPF Alberta is partnering with two University of Alberta professors in a research project studying attrition in French immersion classrooms.

French immersion remains a popular program of choice in school divisions across Alberta. Although the program initially has strong enrolment, retention of students from kindergarten through the last year of high school is a major challenge. Statistics provided by Alberta Education indicate a 67% attrition rate of students who do not complete French immersion up to grade 12. This issue has not yet been examined and thus is not clearly understood. Understanding what drives parental decisions is key if we are to improve retention in French immersion programs in Alberta.

The University of Alberta is partnering with Canadian Parents for French to study attrition in French immersion programs. Understanding reasons for withdrawal from the program will allow for recommendations that can strengthen the program and thus help improve overall retention from Kindergarten through Grade 12 in the province. CPF AB has been the partner primarily responsible for reaching out to all educational stakeholders and potential respondents, as well as part of the content development committee.




CPF Alberta AGM Virtual Meeting
