About Us

anadian Parents for French is a nationwide, research-informed, volunteer organization that represents 35,000 members across Canada and champions the opportunity to learn and use French for all those who call Canada home.

Originally a small group of concerned parents who met in Ottawa founded Canadian Parents for French in 1977. These parents wanted to ensure that all children would have the opportunity to become bilingual in the Canadian school system.

Canadian Parents for French has evolved into a proactive National Network with 12 Branches and offices and over 140 Chapters, serving its members and educational stakeholders in communities nationwide. We recognize that our CPF National office is located on the unceded lands of the Anishinaabe people, that our Branch offices are located on lands of over 24 Indigenous peoples whose contributions and historic importance must be connected to our collective commitment to the promise and challenge of Truth and Reconciliation in all our communities.

In 2021-2022, Canadian Parents for French worked together as a national network to lead governance initiatives in support of Canadian parents and FSL learners, with a focus to building strong, inclusive, equitable and shared leadership, supporting engaged membership and volunteers, and delivering relevant, quality programming to parents and youth learning and using French. Our work has, despite our advocacy position of access for all, brought to the forefront the acknowledgement how some voices and experiences are often missing from decision making processes exacerbating systemic inequities in our society. The CPF Boards and staff leaders have committed to take a learning and change journey. Our efforts focus on understanding the roots of the inequities and building an approach to change and transform how we work. We are undertaking difficult and challenging conversations, but we are committed to the changes that are required to remain relevant and serve all those who call Canada home. We promise you, our members, and stakeholders, to listen, share our learnings with you and engage you in this important and ongoing work.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

nere's no question that the past 12 months have been challenging, with COVID-19 creating disruption, uncertainty and suffering for so many. Through it all, I am proud of how the Canadian Parents for French community has adapted to these challenges with resilience, creativity and flexibility.

Indeed, it has also been a year of growth and opportunity for CPF. At a national level, we continue to reconsider our governance model in a thoughtful process to remain an efficient and effective organization. In that vein, we have also made progress on addressing the inequities within CPF and society by engaging with an external Diversity, Equity and Inclusion expert to create a report with actionable changes we are committed to realizing.

There are exciting conversations around the extension of our mandate on both sides of the kindergarten to grade 12 academic spectrums. With increasing awareness around the importance of early exposure to second language opportunities, CPF hopes to support initiatives around bilingualism in preschool. Additionally, we are seeing more and more bilingual programs in post-secondary contexts. This is the direct result of strong French Immersion and French as a Second Language programs graduating students wanting to extend their French education experience.

As a provincial branch, there continues to be acute advocacy efforts made on behalf of students and families seeking equitable access to French education. As a respected organization supporting French Education, we are often invited to sit at the table with education leaders and policy makers, exemplified in our involvement with the updating of the Official Languages Act. Additionally, and importantly, we seek to support grassroots, chapter-level advocacy initiatives in communities of every size.

CPF Alberta continues to encourage youth in their bilingualism through socio-cultural activities and projects. Recognizing that language learning is not simply an academic pursuit, CPF creates opportunities for our students to interact in French outside the classroom. From engaging performers touring schools in the province to offering events such as the French Family Fun Weekends, CPF Alberta directly impacts the depth and breadth of our students' experiences in French.

To that end, my thanks to our executive director, board members, staff and volunteers for their hard work and resolute commitment to our mandate of linguistic duality.


CPF Medicine Hat Chapter

CPF Alberta **Advocates** for Federal **Funding**



CPF Alberta regularly meets and communicates with Alberta Education, and advocates for federal funding of Campus Saint-Jean, and around funding cuts to French Second Language programs in Alberta. This past year has brought forth exceptional challenges with Alberta Education in regards to their proposed curriculum, cuts to FSL OLEP Funding and the loss of FSL distance programming. CPF Alberta regularly meets with representatives of both the ministry of Education and their French Education Services to keep them apprised of the current parent perspective of FSL education and the curriculum.

Research



CPF Alberta continues its partnership with the University of Alberta in the study of attrition in French Immersion programs. Our funders are currently reviewing the data and we anticipate a report will be

delivered this fiscal year.

Partnerships

CPF Alberta continues to strengthen it's long-time partnership with Project ACCENT – More than seventeen (17) years now! We also participated in ACFA's (Association canadienne-français de l'Alberta) five (5) year strategic plan. For the first time, they will address French Immersion and FSL education. We also assisted the Edmonton Catholic Schools in the development of a script for a video "What to Expect When I Register my Child in French Immersion?"



📭 he Canadian Parents for French Alberta Branch office has been busy supporting the 27 chapters, 1,400 members, French-second-language programs and Alberta's students this past year.

Candas Resch retired after more than 17 years and – after 7 years – Morgan Shervey will be leaving us to start her family. We continue to support CPF NWT with all of their operations and activities. We have — and continue to — advocate for a better curriculum, a dedicated Department of French Education Services within Alberta Education, and additional OLEP funding for all French immersion and FSL programs.

Our support for student activities included the French Family Fun Weekends, the Francophone Games, and Hello, Bonjour! — a partnered program with the Office of the Commissioner of Official Languages to encourage grade 7 and 8 students to stay in French. We are revitalizing the French for Immersion Parents in-person course and are currently making available a virtual version of the course for parents across Canada. A self-paced online version of the course is also under development. CPF Alberta is also looking forward to hosting the delayed Camping en Français this coming summer.

We have offered parent education sessions as part of our French Family Fun Weekends, locally in Chapters and virtually for parents around the province. CPF Alberta is eagerly anticipating the release of the final results of the French immersion retention study in which we partnered with researchers at Campus Saint-Jean. Through representation on the Alberta French Language Education Consortium, Faculty Saint-Jean's Faculty Council, the Centre collégial de l'Alberta's Executive Committee and Calgary Board of Education's Language Advisory Committee, we are ensuring that your perspective is represented province-wide. Finally, staff and board members are working with the CPF Network to review the current reality and plan for the future of our organization.

Remember – « Une langue différente est une vision différente de la vie. » (A different language is a different vision of life.) Let us ensure that our children all have opportunities to experience this different vision of life.

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
