- What is your position on the new French kindergarten to grade 6 curriculum?
- With a nationwide shortage of French-speaking teachers, what is your plan to attract and retain professional teachers and other education workers to Alberta?
- What is your plan to support French immersion teachers and administrator in insuring student's success across the province?
- How will you advocate for specialized education programs and supports for Alberta's French immersion and Francophone students?
- What plans do you have to provide resources and supports for mental health in Alberta schools? Will there be sufficient resources in *French immersion* schools as well?
- What is your plan to reach the Alberta Learning Commission's (2003) class size requirements especially for French immersion classrooms?
- Will your Party transfer current private school funding to support programs for students in poverty?
- What steps will you take to enhance routine upkeep and modernization efforts for antiquated school buildings?
- What is your plan to improve the state of education in Alberta in your term? How will that plan be executed?
- Will you commit to restoring public education funding to above the national average, match funding to inflation and the growing number of students?
