Will food be provided during the weekend?

For those that might be interested, a free pancake breakfast is taking place at the National Historic Site information center Saturday am. This is not organized by CPF.

CPF Alberta will have one dinner on Saturday night (Catered supper with a potluck dessert*) and one breakfast Sunday morning (pancake breakfast catered by Confluence Heritage Society). *Please label ingredients for your dessert.

Please make sure to bring your own food and snacks for the duration of the weekend.

There will be no access to cooking facilities, plates, cutlery etc. Please make sure to bring means to cook and dish up your food.

Food Storage?

Reduce the possibility of wildlife interactions by storing food and other scented items in a hard-sided vehicle or motorhome when not in use. Food lockers are available onsite.

Cooking Facilities?

Please make sure to bring your own way to cook your meals.

Is there drinkable water on site?

Yes, there are taps you can use for cooking or drinking. There is no location to fill your trailer though. Please make sure to arrive prepared.

Are there Dump & Water RV stations?

The National Historic Site Campground does not have a sani-dump. You will find one in Rocky Mountain House at the <u>information centre</u> (museum) on highway 11 across from Canadian Tire.

Sani-Dump services are available for a small fee which includes potable water.

Are there individual fires pits and firewood?

Campfires are only permitted in designated fire pits. Firewood is available for purchase onsite. No outside firewood is permitted. Propane firepits are allowed.

Can I bring a generator if all sites are non-serviced?

Yes, please feel free to bring a generator. Trailer campground: 9:00am – 11:00am & 6:00pm to 8:00pm. Generators are NOT permitted at Walk-in Tenting and Heritage Camping.

Is there a quiet time?

Quiet hours from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.

Is there Ice available on site?

No, there will not be ice available on site. There are stores in the Town of Rocky Mountain House.

Things to bring

- Cookware (small BBQ, plates and cutlery, cooking utensils)
- Camp chairs
- Wagon
- Rain gear
- Sunscreen, bug spray, hats
- Water bottles
- Sleeping bags, blankets and pillows especially for those staying in the cabins, Tipis or Trappers tents as these are **NOT** provided
- Food, coolers to store your food
